
Thank you for your letter of 13th December, 1972. Below I give a list of the plants that I have to offer:-

The prices quoted do not include transportation. I am able to send off 1 Kilo without any difficulties, but anything over requires an export permit. 1 Kilo would cost between \$12. and \$14. Air freight is a minimum of 20 Kilos which costs \$25., but all air freight packages have to go through the Agricultural Inspection Dept.,

I normally collect the plants and then send them off without keeping them for any length of time in my garden. I would mention that most of my plants come from the desert here or up in the mountains.
